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## What is the Arkansas Veterans Coalition?

# Non-AVC Bills Opposed by AVC

#### • HB 1545

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS MILITARY CHILD SCHOOL TRANSITIONS ACT OF 2021.

### Why did the AVC oppose the Bill?

- Representative Karilyn Brown (R, District 67) heard about the AVC's Issue 4 (provide for excused mental health absences for children of fallen service members in all the state's public schools) and contacted the AVC Government Affairs Committee Chairman. She stated that her late husband was an Air Force Officer, and she was a passionate supporter of veterans' issues. She wanted to sponsor a bill to address the AVC's Issue 4.
- Although the AVC and the AVC Member Organization, Hearts of Our Heroes (HOOH, a Gold Start Family-supporting non-profit), offered to provide support for drafting the bill, Rep. Brown engaged a Member of the Central Arkansas Military Officers Association of America (MOAA), Col. D. K. Berry (USAF, Retired), to work with the Bureau of Legislative Research (BLR) to draft a bill.
- Despite repeated attempts by AVC and HOOH to seek to engage in the drafting process to provide critical/essential information, Rep. Brown did not respond to those offers.
- On a late Friday afternoon, the AVC/HOOH was provided a copy of a draft bill for AVC/HOOH review and comment before the anticipated filing of a bill the following Monday.
- AVC/HOOH noted although they had some language related to AVC's Issue 4, the Bill was much (1) much broader and focused on several other education-related issues not related to AVC's Issue 4, (2) although there was verbiage that was intended to incorporate AVC's Issue 4 into the Bill, the verbiage did not adequately or address the issue.
- AVC/HOOH submitted comments and suggested verbiage changes to Bill so that it would address AVC's Issue 4.
- The recommended amendments provided by AVC/HOOH were rejected by Rep. Brown who stated her intent to file the Bill as written.
- Another attempt to explain why the bill did not only adequately address AVC's Issue 4, but there were other material points in the bill the AVC/HOOH noted could be problematic and provided an explanation along with suggested verbiage/amendment that might enhance the bill and avoid what the AVC/HOOH saw as potential unintended consequences should the bill pass as written. And, once again, the AVC/HOOH stated her bill was sufficiently flawed, and if the bill was filed as written, the AVC/HOOH could not support the bill and would be put in a position it did not want to take, oppose the Bill and "speak against the bill in committee".
- Rep. Brown, again, rejected any input by AVC/HOOH or to consider amending her bill before filing it.
- The bill was filed and referred to the House Education Committee where Rep. Brown and MOAA representative (DK Berry) introduced and spoke for the bill and the AVC (Mark Diggs) and HOOH (Sharri Briley) spoke against the bill ((See video of the bill's Committee testimony Here).
- Approximately two hours after the Committee Meeting, Rep. Brown informed the AVC she had removed the AVC Issue 4 verbiage from her bill and recommended the AVC seek a sponsor for a bill that would address its specific issues- which we did with HB1986 which was enacted.

TO AMEND THE LAW CONCERNING THE APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE ARKANSAS VETERANS' CHILD WELFARE SERVICE AND THE REPORTING OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE ARKANSAS VETERANS' CHILD WELFARE SERVICE.

## • SB 497 – Passed - Delivered to Governor/Awaiting Signature & ACT #

TO REQUIRE THE CREATION OF A POSTER REGARDING VETERANS' BENEFITS AND SERVICES; AND TO REQUIRE CERTAIN EMPLOYERS TO DISPLAY THE POSTER.

## • SB 515 - Passed - Delivered to Governor/Awaiting Signature & ACT #

AN ACT TO AMEND THE ARKANSAS HISTORY UNIT REQUIREMENT IN PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS; TO REQUIRE THAT A UNIT DEDICATED TO ARKANSAS VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES BE INCLUDED WITHIN EXISTING ARKANSAS HISTORY COURSE CONTENT GUIDELINES.

## The AVLS

## How the AVC develops its legislative issues.

The AVC Veterans Legislative Session (<u>"AVLS"</u>) is a biennial <u>non-partisan</u> training retreat where a statewide delegation of selected individuals ("Delegates") are trained in the state's legislative process and develop recommended legislative issues for the AVC to pursue in the subsequent Arkansas General Assembly.


AVC's inaugural AVLS training retreat was held on July 25-27 at the Winthrop Rockefeller Institute. Each of twenty (20) selected Delegates submitted, discussed, and debated their particular issue in a structured forum and, as a body, voted to submit five (5) of these issues to the AVC Executive Board for their review and consideration of presentation to the statewide AVC Membership for their review and vote at the AVC's meeting scheduled for September 20, 2024

Subsequently, the AVC Executive Board met on August 14, 2024, to review, discuss, and vote on each of the five (5) issues submitted by the AVLS Delegation. Each of the five (5) issues were unanimously approved and submitted with a "*Do Pass*" recommendation to the statewide AVC Membership for their consideration.

On September 20, 2024, the statewide AVC Membership reviewed, debated, and unanimously voted to approve the each of the following issues and authorized the AVC Governmental Affairs Committee to present these issues and seek the support for introduction of and passage of legislation to address each of of the following issues:

- <u>AVC Issue 1</u>: 100% Disabled Veteran Sales Tax Exemption
- <u>AVC Issue 2</u>: Homestead and Personal Property Tax Exemption for Veterans Receiving Non-Service-Connected Pension Benefits
- <u>AVC Issue 3</u>: Help address the added financial costs to the families of Arkansan Reservists and National Guard Members who are activated and deployed outside the state.
- <u>AVC Issue 4:</u> Student Absences for Mental Health or Behavioral Health Needs Should be Marked as Excused Absences
- <u>AVC Issue 5:</u> Veterans receiving VA Disability Compensation and other benefits, such as pensions, fail to notify the VA when they are being incarcerated or released.
